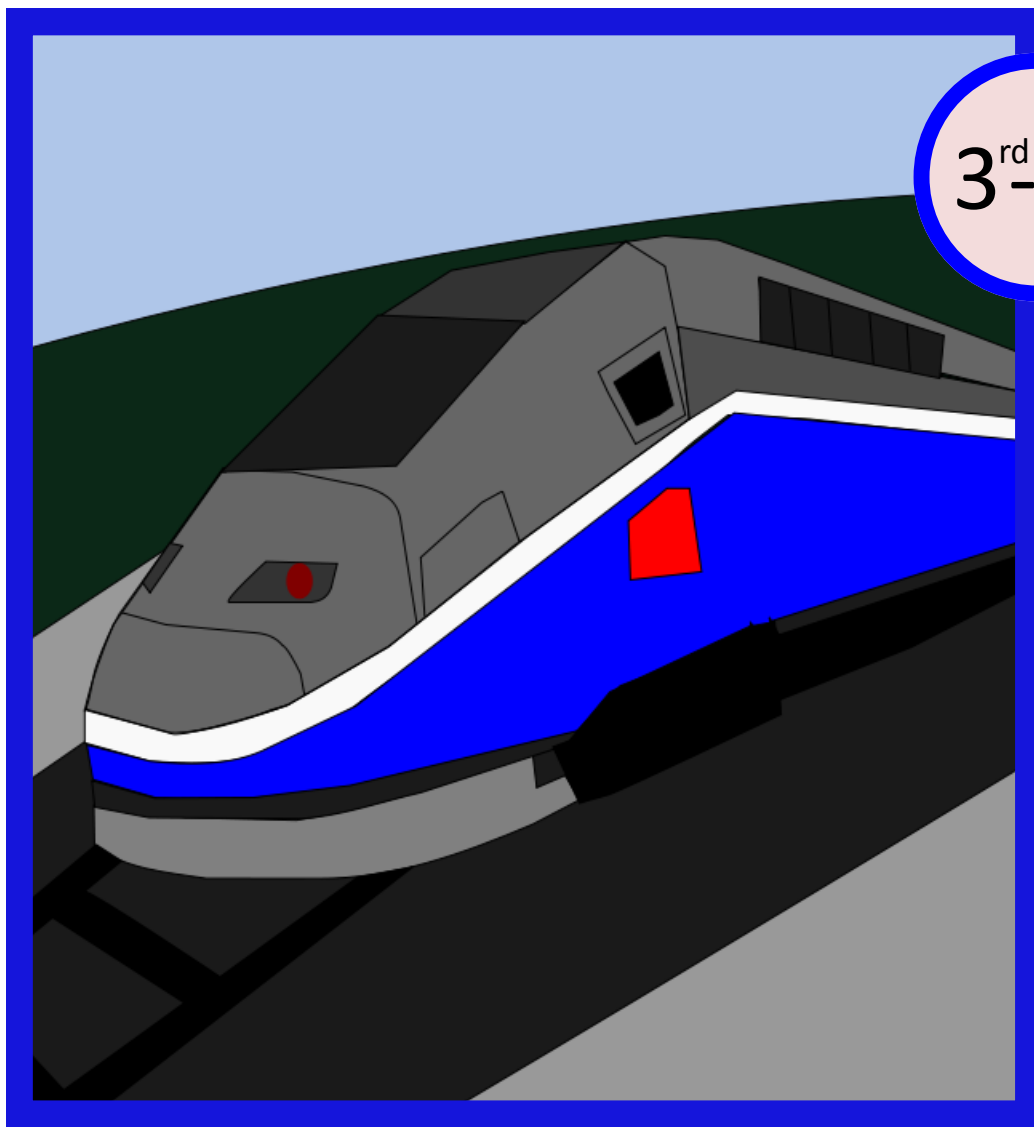

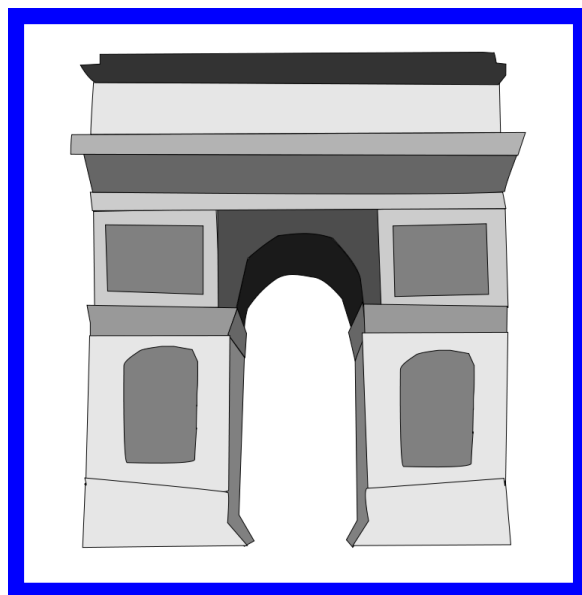


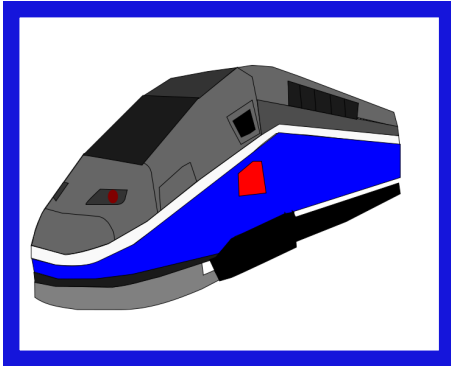

Some prompts may only require a simple answer while others will require more thinking and writing to solve. Either way, encourage your students to write and draw out their thought processes.

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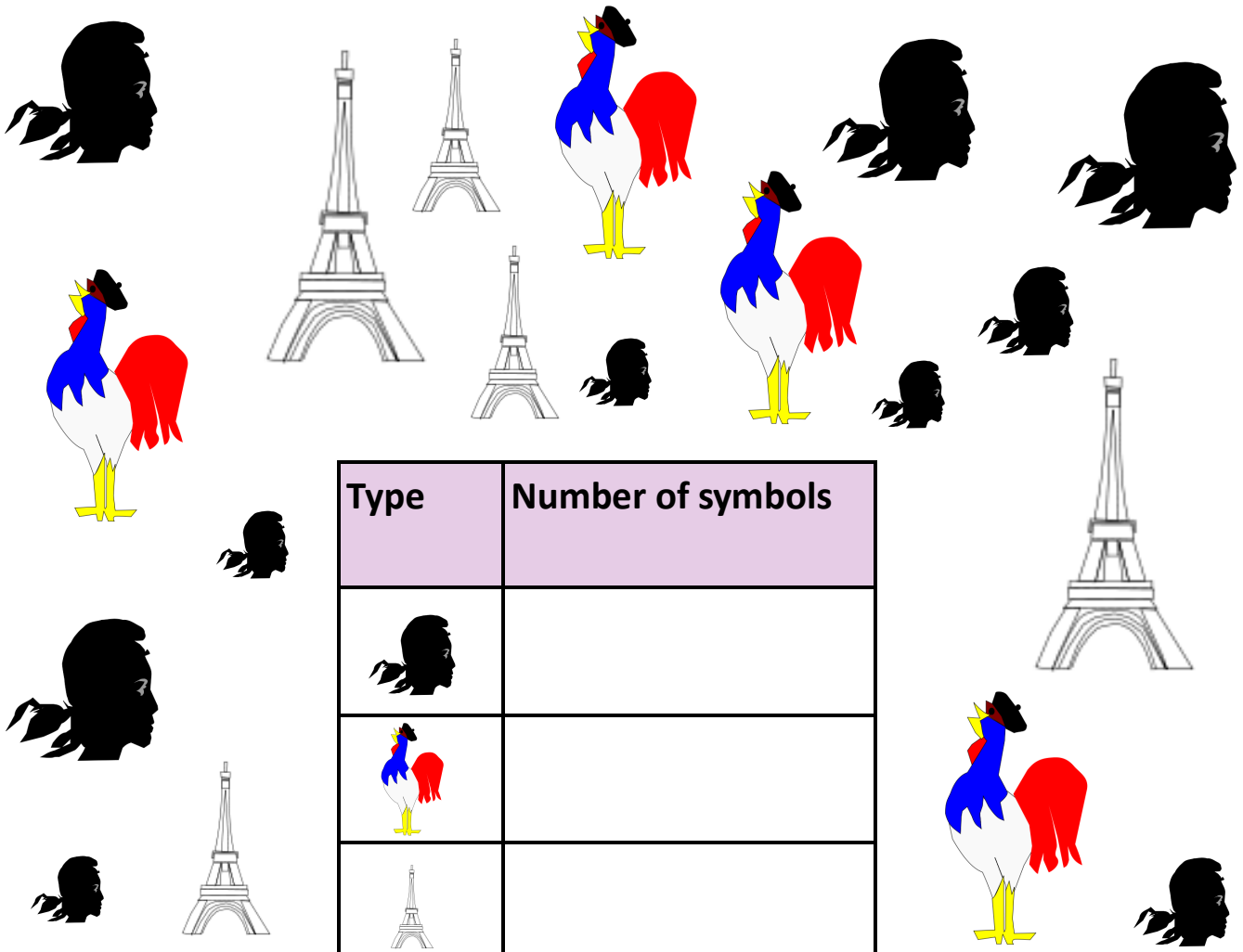





It takes 2 hours and 12 minutes to get from Paris to Lyon while traveling on a *high-speed* TGV train. If Jacques boarded this train and left Paris at 8:15am, at what time will he arrive in Lyon?



TGV stands for Train à Grande Vitesse, or “Train of High Speed”. A TGV train set the record for the fastest wheeled train, reaching a top speed of 357.2 miles per hour.

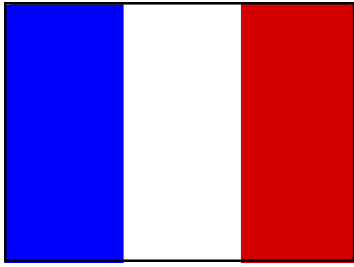
The Gallic Rooster is an unofficial symbol of France. It is often used on the jerseys of France's national sports teams, such as the teams for football (soccer) and rugby.



The **Eiffel Tower** was constructed in 1889 as the entrance arch for the 1889 World's Fair in Paris. How old is the Eiffel Tower now? How old will it be in 10 more years?



The Eiffel Tower, a structure made of wrought iron, was constructed for the 1889 World's Fair by engineer and designer Gustave Eiffel. It is one of the most recognizable structures in the world, and is also the world's most-visited paid monument.

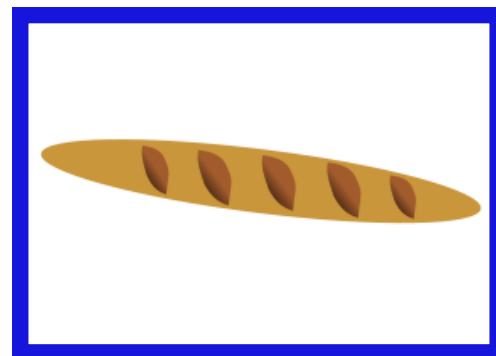


- How many rectangles can you find in the French flag?
- How many rectangles would you find in **10** French flags?
- How many rectangles would you find in **100** French flags?



The French flag, known in France as the “tricolore” (tri-color), has three vertical bands of blue, white and red. During the French revolution of 1789 the Paris militia wore outfits of blue and red when storming the Bastille. When creating the national flag a band of white, recognized as an ancient French color, was included.

A baguette is a long, thin loaf of French bread. It is crusty on the outside and tender and moist on the inside. 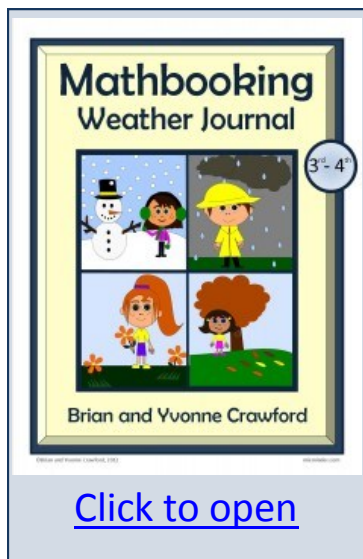
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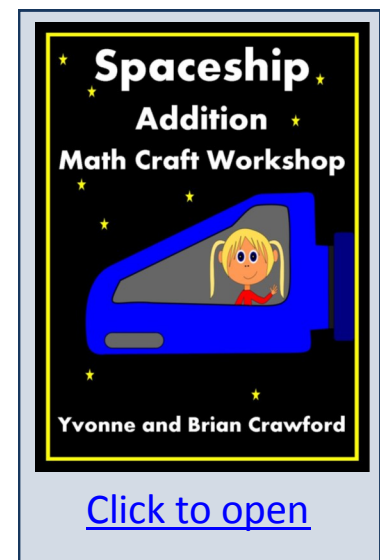
Here are some more **free activities** that your students may enjoy:
